#### **PUERTO RICO TODAY**

Puerto Rico's government is finally coming out of bankruptcy, but considerable challenges remain to achieve long term economic growth. More than 40% of the population depends on federal assistance programs, and labor participation, although slightly increasing, remains at a dismal 42%. Federal transfers make up about 30% of the US territory's Gross National Product (GDP), and productive sectors are hindered by high taxes, excessive

bureaucracy, costly and outdated infrastructure, and a labor shortage.

These barriers to free enterprise not only discourage investment and the creation of local wealth; they directly affect Puerto Rico's ability to retain and attract its most valuable asset: young adults who are more inclined to engage in entrepreneurial projects, and can participate in the island's reconstruction following a series of natural disasters.

Consequently, migration is high. Talented people in productive ages are leaving for the US mainland in search of stability and opportunity.

Structural reforms to streamline bureaucracy, reduce the tax burden, and promote work are urgently needed to improve the island's competitiveness. Unfortunately, local political bickering and conditions set by the Federal Oversight and Management Board (FOMB) to ensure fiscal stability and compliance with debt obligations delay concrete policy actions to promote change.

Frustration in Puerto Rico is high. Illiberal groups financed by left-leaning movements in Latin America and the United States are feeding polarization and threatening to weaken property rights.

## BUT THERE IS HOPE FOR CHANGE

More people are realizing that Puerto Rico's current state of play is mainly the effect of years of bad fiscal policies and intrusive intervention by the government. Consequently, there is a growing understanding that big government doesn't work.

In a CRECE poll conducted among 791 island residents in 2023, 9 out 10 adults said that government spending is excessive, close to 80% believe welfare programs are failing to lift people out of poverty, and 60% strongly agree that bureaucratic processes to get permits should be streamlined.

Moreover, our experience and new research tells us that, given the opportunities to prosper, people would remain in Puerto Rico. Because above all, we love our home!

We must tap on these opportunities to instill the values of individual and economic freedom in our youth, our families, and communities so they demand and drive policy change to achieve prosperity.


